- These will be taken if seen or heard during non-studio times, such as when the teacher is talking. There is NO texting, watching videos, etc. allowed at any time...on your phones. Use the computers for research.
- If taken, you will need to sign for your phone in the office. The second time, your parent will need to sign for the phone. The third time could result in a referral.

- I have reviewed the syllabus for the Journalism course and understand the expectations of the class.
- I understand the grading procedures and what is expected of me in the course.
- I understand that if I submit any stories or photographs past the deadlines stated that I will lose points for late submissions. For stories that can be covered for an issue but must be submitted past the deadline, a baseline story with background info must be submitted at deadline with outline of questions to be asked for quotes at the event. Revisions and final copy must be made by the class day following the event.
- I understand that there is NO EXCUSE for missing a deadline, including sickness (planned or unexpected) or absence (planned or unexpected) from school or Journalism class specifically. Completed articles are to be emailed in a Word attachment to bhsmaroontribune@gmail.com.
- I understand the behavior requirements for myself and understand that misbehavior could result in removal from the newspaper staff for the remainder of the school year at any time during the school year.

- I understand that I may have to attend school events (both away and at home) to cover activities for the newspaper.
- I understand that, should it be necessary, I may have to work on newspaper during lunch, after school hours and/or on weekends to complete deadlines.
- I understand that ads for the fall semester must be sold BEFORE **December 1** for first semester and **May 1** for second semester and that no credit will be given after that time for late sales.
